Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope you all had a lovely weekend...bring on the new week and new month!

I wanted to send a message to our new parents and students - welcome to Wexham! The new pupils have settled in really well and we look forward to the progress they will make.

This October is Black History Month & Teeth Brushing Month. Keep an eye out on our Twitter and Instagram to see what activities and learning we get up to throughout this month. We are embedding and implementing a lot more multicultural learning into our lessons so that children understand and experience other cultures - we want children to see this as a norm.

As we start our teeth brushing month, please also keep up the teeth brushing habits at home. Oral health is extremely important and children must implement teeth brushing twice a day into their daily routine (as recommended by Dentists). Check out this video (<https://youtu.be/CmZp1wdJAw4>)





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We are still going strong with our daily skipping - the children are enjoying it and the SLT are also joining in because the health benefits are great. Why not try it yourself at home!

Speaking of health, as winter is approaching and colds/bugs are going around, it's vital that we teach our children to continuously wash their hands and sneeze/cough into tissues to prevent the spreading of germs. Please keep up this good practice at home so that children are reminded about good hygiene etiquette.

Similarly, we are still noticing unhealthy lunches being sent in. A reminder that only WATER & MILK are allowed in lunchboxes - no fizzy pop or juices. They should have a water bottle filled with water to drink through the day. Nourishment is extremely important and it is vital to feed our children the right things to help them grow and their minds concentrate. Thank you to the parents who have followed our Healthy Eating policy.

A reminder that the school gates close promptly at 8.45am, children should be on the playground by 8.40am so that they settle into their classrooms on time at 8.45am. Any children who arrive after 8.45am must go around to the Front Office where they will need to sign in. It's important for children to arrive on time as this sets a good routine and structure to their day - we must respect time.

This week, we will be announcing the new Peer Mentors. They will have a few roles around the school but the main one is supporting pupils with mental health and wellbeing. We will also be announcing the new School Council, Eco-Warriors etc so keep an eye out.
