Important Information

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you have had a good weekend and are looking forward to the holidays.

I am really pleased with all we have accomplished this year particularly as it has been one of the hardest years we have ever had. Cast your mind back to Autumn term when isolation rules were relaxed and numbers were predicted to be low. This simply was not the case. Instead, teachers, pupils and parents were intermittently off with COVID. Schools were asked to teach classes and provide remote learning, while covering teachers who were absent. I cannot thank our Learning Support Assistants enough for stepping up.

Due to the lockdown previously, many pupils with SEND had not had their 12-month, 18-month checks meaning they were undiagnosed. Across the country pupils arrived in EYFS without the needed support plans. This made the start of the year very difficult, however we have learnt a lot and are in a much better position to deal with any situation moving forward. Our quality first teaching is and remains excellent and our SEND provision is getting strong and stronger. We have been asked to share our 'exemplary model' with other schools. Given the difficulties we faced, I am even more delighted with our results this year, which have been excellent.

Statutory testing takes place in Reception, Year 1 (phonics screen check), Year 2, year 4 (new multiplication test) and Year 6. All results have been significantly above national in

all but one measure (Year 6 Maths). Maths has dipped nationally and we have this as an improvement target for next year. Each year Local Authorities' moderate schools on rotation and this year our pupils work was external moderated. They were very impressed with the work, leaving our only next step as; 'to support other schools more'.

I wanted to thank the teachers and LSAs for all their hard work this year and the office for managing all the calls, the questions and keeping the school running. You have no idea how hard they have worked! I am proud of how the whole school has stepped in to support each other. A big well done and heartfelt thanks to them all.

Below is an email I recently received from our Phonics consultant...

Thank you for your hard work and determined effort to get every child in your school reading. I have just processed my school's data and you will be pleased to know that your children have scored some of the highest scores of my entire school tracker.

You always take my breath away when we analyse your data but this time of the year shows why it is vital to never let your eye off the ball – excellent RWI lessons followed by high quality Fast Track Tutoring!

It is a pleasure to work with you all and so rewarding as a trainer to push you even further with the other vital elements of literacy. Please thank your staff team and share my happiness with them all – these children now have such a bright future.

Send lots of video links home over the Summer! Have a good rest. Looking forward to working with you next year.

Unfortunately, we had to close the school today and tomorrow for Upper Primary. This was a real shame as we had such a good assembly planned for our Year 6s. Fortunately, we have been able to move it to Wednesday at 9.00am, however I know some pupils have already left. Despite this, we will do our best to make this an enjoyable day and the disco will now take place at 4.00pm on Wednesday. I would like to wish our delightful Year 6s all the best in their new chapter. Their energy, confidence and passion were so evident in the performance, I know they will be fine. They have been delightful and will be sincerely missed!

For any parents who are also leaving us this year, know that we have valued every moment. We could not have done this without you and we honestly will miss seeing you too. Those morning and afternoon exchanges and morning and general chit-chat. Thank you for all you have done and be brave in September.

Looking forward to next year, we are in full swing for preparations and are extremely excited about all that it has to bring. Children will return to school on **Thursday 1st September at 11.00am -11.15am** for this day only, drop off will remain between 8.30am -8.45am. Going forward, KS1 children to be dropped at gate D and KS2 children to be dropped at gate C. You will drop your child off at Moat Drive and leave them at the school

gate, children have been adequately prepared to walk to their classes through the transition day. Timings may differ for certain children, you will have been informed of this by Mrs Harris and the new starters in EYFS are aware of their transitional times.

The collection time is now 3.15pm -3.30pm, collecting from Moat Drive, gate D for entering at gate C for exiting. I understand this may be new for some parents, there will be signs for gate C and D on the first day. The parent carpark is available for you to use though the only entrance point is Moat Drive.


