Afternoon pick-up:

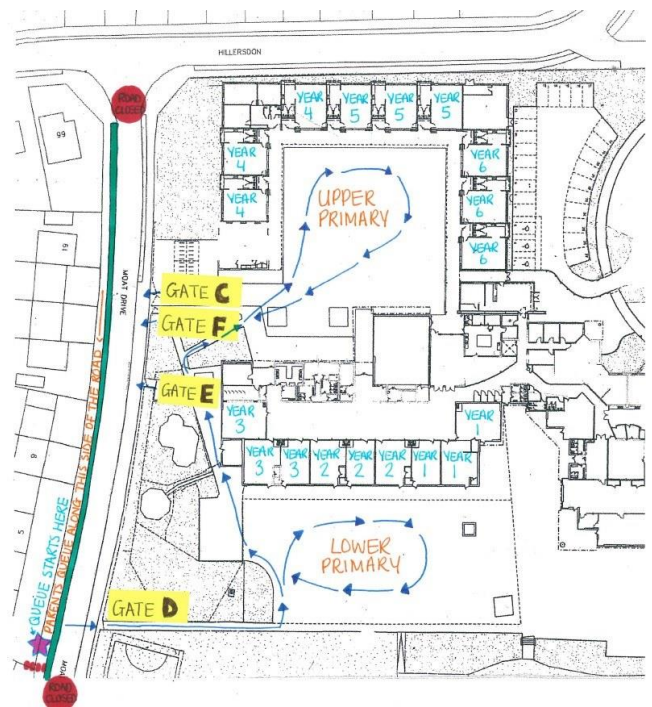
3.00 - 3.15pm - Reception children finish

3.00pm – Key Stage 1 children finish & exit through **GATE C** (If KS1 children have siblings in KS2 they can collect them & leave together through **GATE C**)

3.20pm – Key Stage 2 children finish & exit through **GATE C**



Uniform Checks
