



Author Visit – Ruth Galloway visits Wexham Court Primary School

Ruth Galloway is an award winning author and illustrator, who has worked on a wide range of children's picture books. Her books have been translated into many languages, read on children's television programmes, and are enjoyed by children all over the world.

Ruth says: "I illustrate my picture books in acrylic paints, creating bold, brightly coloured images that bring my characters to life and are full of humour and energy."

On Tuesday 9th February **Nursery** children were so excited to meet Ruth Galloway. They have been reading her books in preparation including Fidgety Fish, Tickly Octopus and Smiley Shark. The children really enjoyed hearing Ruth read some

her stories to them and there were plenty of laughs and giggles.

Reception children were equally excited at their visit the author as they had been learning about her the stories she had written. Ruth Galloway's visit was in conjunction with a visit to Years 3-6 from author, **Dan Freedman**, author of the popular Jamie Johnson books. Dan held an assembly for the children in Years 3 – 6, where he told them about his inspiration as a writer; how he didn't enjoy reading as a child and his work as a sports journalist. The children particularly enjoyed learning about the famous international footballers he has met including Ronaldo and Messi! In the afternoon, 60 children from Year Five and Six were lucky enough to take part in a writing workshop. Since Dan's visit Year 3 have been using his Jamie Johnson Skills From Brazil story to help them understand play scripts. They have

been writing their own play scripts using the story as an inspiration.

E-Safety Workshop



<u>A new poll released by Netmums</u> revealed shocking statistics on internet use by children. The survey of 825 children aged between seven and 16 and 1,127 adults showed that 16.7% of parents allowed children three years old or younger to go online. However, the most alarming statistics showed how exposed and vulnerable children are online.

1. 42.1% of children admit they have seen indecent videos online.

2. One in 12 have exchanged inappropriate messages with other people, while one in 25 have sent indecent photos of themselves.

3. 25% of children get away with pretending to be older to get an account online.

4. One in 20 children admitted arranging a secret meeting with someone they met online.

5. Almost three in 10 parents (29%) let their children use the internet without any restrictions or supervision.

We cannot get away from the fact that our children need to use the internet, but there are many things we can do to protect them from harm. Thank you so much to all the parents who attended, I hope the workshops were a valuable source of information for you.

It was great to see so many parents, over the past 3 weeks, at our Mathematics workshops for Year 1, 2 and 3. The MATHS MASTERY approach requires pupils to learn about number in greater depth than before. The pupils will learn a variety of ways to solve a problem and only when they have mastered an area, will they move on.

Parents experienced some fun maths games, activities and talk tasks as well as learning new ways to support their child at home. Many of them bought Maths packs, which contain resources, games and idea sheets, to further support maths learning at home.

Here are some comments parents made;
