We then came back inside and had a talk with the firemen, and they showed us why it is important to never play with matches or fire and what to do if there ever is a fire. They also showed us all the clothing and equipment they wear when they go to fight fires. It was very informative and we had lots of fun!

Literacy Workshops for Nursery Parents

Thank you to all the parents who attended the literacy workshop for nursery parents, with Mrs Aslam. Children become mark makers, long before we give them any recognition as writers. For example, when they are babies, children are writers as they learn to make marks when they are making marks in their food you give them on the highchair rather than eating it! Becoming a



writer involves many skills and one of the foci of the discussion was how large movements from your arms, learning how to navigate on your bike, are skills which children need to master before being able to hold a pencil effectively, in order to write recognisable letter. Children love to write when they have a purpose behind it and also when they see others, including parents as good role models. Mrs Farooq commented, *'very informative and helpful in understanding the stages of writing a child goes through the years and what is expected in the school'*. Young children need to develop a love for stories in order to become enthusiastic readers or writers. If the stories are based on experiences it enables children to have something 'real' to discuss and act out. I am sure you have all been an audience to your children, acting out 'teachers' or 'mums and dads', which are often a child's favourite narrative to retell.

To enable children to have other stories to add to their repertoire, we arranged for a travelling theatre company to come in and perform the well know story of 'The Hare and Tortoise' on Thursday 25th February for Nursery and Reception. The story was performed using songs and really interactive.

Reception and Nursery both sat beautifully and listened carefully to the music and show. In Reception we will continue to learn about this tale over the next few weeks and think about the moral that it teaches us. In Nursery we have planned many activities around the performance; to teach not only literacy skills but also personal, social and emotional skills.
