



# **Show Racism the Red Card**




Year 5 had the privilege of taking part in workshops lead by "Show Racism the Red Card'. The children were fully immersed in debates surrounding stereotypes, culture, nationality and appropriate definitions for people. The children learnt a lot more about their own identity; the key message was that

the only race is the human race. The children have learnt to take responsibility for their actions and to be respectful of one another. It would be great if parents could speak to the children about the workshops in order to help them reinforce what they have learnt.

# **Rocket Science**

Rocket Science is one of a number of inspiring projects for schools initiated by the UK Space Agency to celebrate the Principia mission of British European Space Agency astronaut Tim Peake to the International Space Station. The Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) Campaign for School Gardening, are working with the UK Space Agency to encourage children and young people to become space biologists in order to weigh up whether it is possible to grow our own food on other planets, millions of miles away from Earth. Rocket Science has been designed to introduce pupils to the practice of working to a structured scientific method, as well as showing pupils the fascinating, 'hidden' science behind



horticulture. Throughout the experiment pupils will measure and record key data for their seeds as they germinate and grow. At the end of the experiment, schools will be asked to upload their data onto a national database, enabling every school taking part to contribute to our global scientific understanding of growing plants in space. The experiment will be starting next week and will last for six weeks.

#### **Book Fair**

The Scholastic Book Fair will be visiting Wexham Court from Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> to Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> April. This is always a popular event and last term we sold over £1000 worth of books! There will be a selection of popular titles at reasonable prices, with a share of the sales going to the school to purchase books for the Library. There will also be items of stationery, posters and bags for sale. Please do come along and have a look.
